Everyone is welcome to submit artworks for this exhibit, regardless of age, artistic experience, or whether you attend any church.

Media: 2D and 3D artwork and framed poetry including sculpture, photography, framed poetry, drawing, painting, mixed media, fabric art, stained glass, etc.

NOTE: All artwork needs an accompanying artist statement to be typed directly online at vineartsboise.org. Go to "Exhibits" > "Type Your Artist Statement".

Deadline to type your statement online is January 16, 2019 at 11:59pm.

Artwork dropped off with NO accompanying statement submitted online will not be accepted.

This exhibit is scheduled to last approximately 2 months.

To be considered for entry into this show,
a tree or trees must be a noticeable part of your art piece.

Ask God to speak to you through His presence and Word when creating this piece.

What if my artwork doesn't fit this theme?
... If it doesn't fit, just wait for a different VineArts exhibit.

If you've decided NOT to submit art for "A Grove of Trees," please
return this entire packet to church so that someone else can use it.

Please note: All artist statements must be typed ONLINE at

We do not accept artwork that's been dropped off without having a corresponding statement
that has been typed online.

Q. Do I need to submit tree imagery that has a certain theme?

A. No, there's not a certain theme. Your imagery can be formal (just for the beauty of it), abstract, conceptual, etc. The image can convey emotional meaning and/or represent spiritual references, but it doesn't have to.

Q. What types of trees can I convey for this exhibit?

A. Images of any type of tree at any stage of growth are welcome. Framed poetry about trees is also welcome for this exhibit. Visual art can include actual or implied texture of trees, tree bark or even wood grain as long as we can connect it with trees. You can explore issues of logging or deforestation, scenes of trees in the city or wilderness, the scientific wonder of trees, how trees affect the rest of creation, scriptural references about trees in the Bible, etc. There are many approaches to the subject of trees.

Q. What if I submit art with trees in it that aren't readily noticeable?

A. Our jury will decide. We're looking for artwork that at least partly involves at least one tree as a visual or conceptual factor, not just some random tree in the corner making it "technically" present somewhere in your image.

He is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit. Jeremiah 17:8

For there is hope for a tree, if it be cut down, that it will sprout again, and that its shoots will not cease. Job 14:7

Then shall the trees of the forest sing for joy before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth. 1 Chronicles 16:33

He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers. Psalm 1:3

So, every healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. Matthew 7:17

The visions of my head as I lay in bed were these: I saw, and behold, a tree in the midst of the earth, and its height was great. The tree grew and became strong, and its top reached to heaven, and it was visible to the end of the whole earth. Its leaves were beautiful and its fruit abundant, and in it was food for all. The beasts of the field found shade under it, and the birds of the heavens lived in its branches, and all flesh was fed from it. Daniel 4:10-12

And out of the ground the Lord God made to spring up every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food. The tree of life was in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Genesis 2:9

Rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. Colossians 2:7

Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a desire fulfilled is a tree of life. Prov 3:12

But I am like a green olive tree in the house of God. I trust in the steadfast love of God forever and ever. Psalm 52:8

The glory of Lebanon shall come to you, the cypress, the plane, and the pine, to beautify the place of my sanctuary, and I will make the place of my feet glorious. Isaiah 60:13
