Artwork dropped off with NO accompanying statement submitted online will not be accepted.

To be considered for entry into this show,

Ask God to speak to you through his presence and his Holy Bible when creating this piece.

Q. Do I need to submit artwork about a certain type of spirituality?

A. Yes, the theme of this exhibit is Christianity as found in the Christian scriptures (which is the Old Testament and New Testament together).

Q. What is the Trinity? Who is the Holy Spirit?

A. The Trinity is how Christians summarize the presence of 3 distinct entities found throughout the Bible who together are one God. We refer to them as God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. They are One God and commune together, enjoying each other forever. None of the three were created; all three have existed for eternity, before time began. There are no other gods living in multiple universes. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are it.

John 1 says ALL things were created through the Son, Jesus Christ (another name for God the Son is Messiah, which means "Promised Deliverer"). Jesus tells us he *only* does what he sees his Father is already doing. Jesus invites each of us to address God the Father as "Dada" or "Papa," just as a baby calls out to their daddy in happiness or distress. That's how much God loves us!

While Jesus was preparing to re-enter heaven, he told his followers he would send the Holy Spirit to live inside each believer. He said the Holy Spirit is our constant friend, comfortor, counselor, and spiritual guide in everyday life. The Holy Spirit nudges us to see what the Father is doing all around us, and helps us join into what he is doing--which is all about God's great love! --Jessie Nilo

"There are four areas that divine healing may be applied to: the spirit, the effects of past hurts, the body, and demonization. Each of these requires a different application of healing prayer. Most people have problems in at least two of them. For example, sometimes I start praying for people's past hurts, which opens up the need to pray for a physical problem, and then suddenly, I discover a demon! I used to think, "How complex can this get?" Then the Lord reminded me that human beings are complex—after all, we have been made in God's image—but the Holy Spirit is capable of sorting out all of our problems.... God may choose to work through us unexpectedly, even though we do not normally have the healing gift.

So we should be open to his anointing us at any time."
